

Each year DEQ publishes its Underground Storage Tank Public Record, as required by the Energy Act Policy of 2005.

Title XV, Subtitle B of this act, contains amendments to Subtitle 1 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act - the original legislation that created the underground storage tank (UST) program. The amendments focus on preventing releases. Among other things, they expand eligible uses of the Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Trust Fund and include provisions regarding inspections, operator training, delivery prohibition, secondary containment and financial responsibility, and cleanup of releases that contain oxygenated fuel additives.
